



June 18, 2017: The Redeemer Judges and Saves

Adults: (Singles, College, Newlyweds, Empty Nesters, etc.)

1. What “advance notice” has God given humanity regarding His judgment against sin?
2. What are some ways we can show others that we find our protection and salvation in Jesus, whose blood was shed for us?
3. How should the severity of God’s judgment and the magnitude of His mercy affect the way we live?

Students: (Grades 6th-12th)

1. In what ways does our family celebrate special occasions such as birthdays, Christmas, etc.? Do you think it’s equally important for our family to celebrate the Lord’s Supper together? Why or why not?
2. The blood on the door was a public statement for all to see. What characteristics should distinguish our family from those who do not worship God?
3. How does worshiping God together as a family impact our witness for Christ?

Children: (K-5th Grade)

1. What name did God use to identify Himself to Moses? (See Exodus 3:13-14.)
2. The story of Moses points to whose greater calling and rescue? (the call of Jesus to come to earth to save people from sin)
3. How can God use you? How can you give Him the credit?

Preschool:

1. What would you do if you found a baby alone in a basket?
2. Moses made excuses about why God should send someone else to Pharaoh. What excuses do we make for not doing things?
3. Talk about a time your family cried out to God for help.
